John H. Witherington presided as the Chairperson of the meeting. The City Clerk, Alton Starling, presided as the Clerk of the Meeting.

The Executive Committee met at 4:00 PM to discuss agenda items. Marsha Gaylard, Pike County Economic Development Corporation President, Scott Pierce, Bond Attorney, Dickey Calhoun, City Attorney, Melissa Sanders, Planner/Administrator were also present. At 4:48, the council went to council chambers to conduct business.

Councilman Witherington motioned to approve the Hurt Brothers Lounge license on a conditional basis, as addressed in Mr. King's letter, for 180 days upon which time the council would re-evaluate the license, seconded by Councilman Dunn, and being put to vote was unanimously approved.

Councilman Witherington introduced the Off Premises Only 050 Retail Beer License and the Off Premises Only 070 Retail Table Wine License for Food World. Councilwoman Henderson motioned to approve the licenses, seconded by Councilman Meeks, and being put to vote was unanimously approved.

Councilman Witherington introduced and summarized aloud Resolution 2013 - 19 - Authorizing an Additional Payroll. Councilman Paramore motioned to approve Resolution 2013 - 19, seconded by Councilwoman Henderson, and being put to vote was unanimously approved.

Councilman Witherington introduced and summarized Ordinance 328 - Amending the Zoning Ordinance to Rezone Real Property and announced that this was the time and place to hear those in favor of or against Ordinance 328. No one spoke in favor of or against Ordinance 328.

Councilwoman Meeks motioned to approve Ordinance 328, seconded by Councilman Paramore, and being put to vote was unanimously approved.

Councilman Witherington introduced and summarized Ordinance 331 - Authorizing Guarantee Agreement. Councilman Paramore motioned to suspend the rules and immediately consider Ordinance 331, seconded by Councilwoman Henderson, and being put to vote recorded the following voice vote: Dunn, Aye. Meeks, Aye. Paramore, Aye. Witherington, Aye. Henderson, Aye. Upon approval to immediately consider Ordinance 331, Councilman Meeks motioned to approve Ordinance 331, seconded by Councilman Dunn, and being put to vote was unanimously approved.

The Executive Committee recommended Marcus Paramore to be appointed to the Planning Commission and being put to vote was approved by a majority vote, with Councilman Paramore abstaining.
